### Save



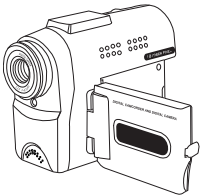

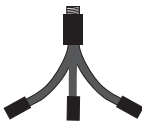

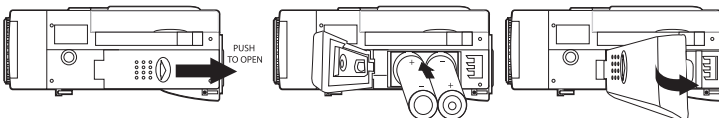

## • Installing the batteries

1. Open the battery door at the bottom of the **SPYEN AIAS/VIVA-DV1**, follow the arrow direction.
2. Insert 2 x AA battery follow the polarity, showed in the battery compartment.
3. Close the battery door.





## ● Turning the Camera On and Off

### For start with Capture Mode

1. Select the Capture/playback selector to Capture Mode 
2. Pull left to open the LCD panel
3. Press and hold the Power On/Off button  until the LCD on
4. You will see "VIDEO" / "STILL IMAGE" / "AUDIO" / "PC/MAC" on the Display



### For start with Playback Mode

1. Select the Capture/playback selector to playback Mode 
2. Pull left to open the LCD panel
3. Press and hold the Power On/Off button  until the LCD on
4. You will see "VIDEO"/"STILL IMAGE"/"AUDIO" on the Display



To start capture or playback Video/Images, Please refer to Chapter 2 and Chapter 3.







## 2 Recording Video/Still Image/Audio





Scene complexity affects a picture's file size. For example, a picture of tree in autumn has a larger file size than a picture of blue sky at the same resolution and quality setting. Therefore, the number of pictures and the length of the video clip you can store on the memory card and internal memory may vary, and the image counter is for reference only. (i.e., may not deduce one by one)

## ● Recording Video/Still Image/Audio





### Video

1. Select the Capture/playback selector to Capture Mode 
2. Pull left to open the LCD panel
3. Press the Power On/Off button  until the LCD on
4. Press UP  and DOWN  button to select "VIDEO" on the LCD Display
5. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
6. Press UP  and DOWN  button to Zoom in and Zoom out
7. To start capture Video, press the shutter button fully down
8. Record time counter will show on the top right hand corner of the LCD
9. To stop capture Video, press the shutter button fully down again

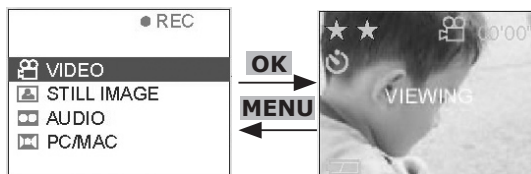
### Still image

1. Select the Capture/playback selector to Capture Mode 
2. Pull left to open the LCD panel
3. Press the Power On/Off button  until the LCD on
4. Press UP  and DOWN  button to select "STILL IMAGE" on the LCD Display
5. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
6. Press UP  and DOWN  button to Zoom in and Zoom out
7. To start capture Still image, press the shutter button fully down to take a picture

### Audio

1. Select the Capture/playback selector to Capture Mode 
2. Pull left to open the LCD panel
3. Press the Power On/Off button  until the LCD on
4. Press UP  and DOWN  button to select "Audio" on the LCD Display
5. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
6. To start capture audio, press the shutter button fully down
7. Record time counter will show on the top right hand corner of the LCD
8. To stop capture audio, press the shutter button fully down again

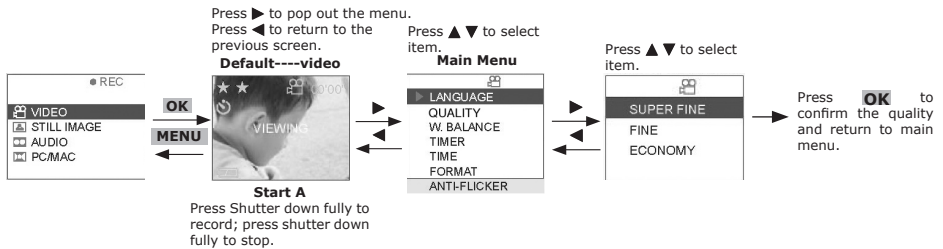

## ● Setting Picture/Video clip Quality

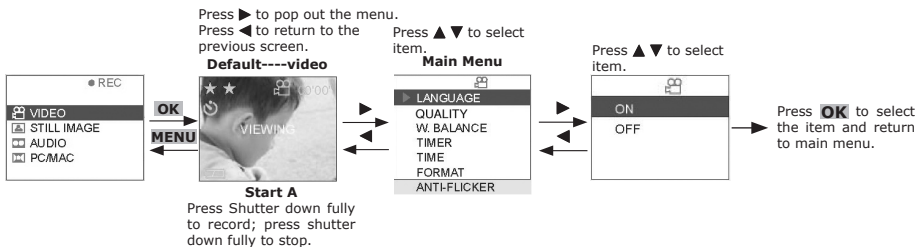
1. Select the Capture/playback selector to Capture Mode
2. Pull left to open the LCD panel
3. Press the Power On/Off button until the LCD on
4. Press UP and DOWN button to select "Video" or "Still Image" on the LCD Display
5. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
6. Press RIGHT button
7. Press UP and DOWN button and select "Quality"
8. Press RIGHT button
9. Press UP and DOWN button to set the Quality. ie Super Fine/Fine/Economy.
10. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm Quality selected
11. Press LEFT button to resume capture mode



## ● Setting Self-timer

Your Camera is designed with a self timer function which will allow you to take pictures with a 10 second timer built in.

1. Select the Capture/playback selector to Capture Mode
2. Pull left to open the LCD panel
3. Press the Power On/Off button until the LCD on
4. Press UP and DOWN button to select "VIDEO" or "STILL IMAGE" on the LCD Display
5. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
6. Press RIGHT button
7. Press UP and DOWN button and select "Timer"
8. Press RIGHT button
9. Press UP and DOWN button and select "ON" to activate self timer
10. Press **OK** to confirm Self-timer activated
11. Press LEFT button to resume capture mode



**Remarks:**  
Press any button within the 10 second self-timer will disable the Self-timer function.

## ● Using the SD (Secure Digital) Card or MMC Card

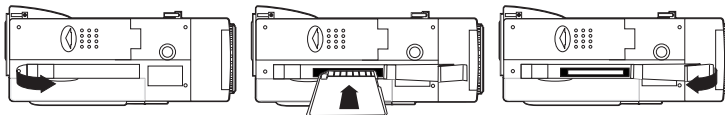
Your camera comes with approximately 7MB of built-in flash memory for storing pictures/video clip/ audio. You can expand memory using a commercially available SD Card/MMC Card. The camera senses whether a memory card is inserted, and automatically saves pictures accordingly. Note that you can not save pictures to built-in flash memory while a memory card is installed in the camera.

### IMPORTANT!

- Make sure you turn off the camera before inserting or removing a memory card.
- Be sure to orient the card correctly when inserting it. Never try to force a memory card into the slot when you feel resistance.
- Though the camera also supports use of an MMC (MultiMediaCard) in place of an SD memory card, the data processing speed in the case of an MMC is much slower than that for an SD memory card. Because of this, we recommend that you choose an SD memory card whenever possible.
- SD memory cards have a write protect switch, which you can use to protect against accidental deletion of picture data. "Whenever you want to record, format or delete item in the SD Card, you must disable write protection before any of above to action."

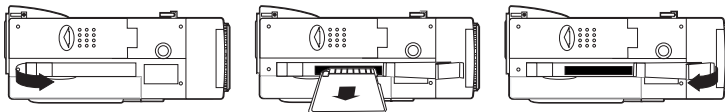
## Inserting the SD (Secure Digital) Card / MMC Card

Turn off the camera and open the SD card slot cover as illustrated. Insert the SD card/MMC Card, ensure the card is inserted the correct position as illustrated, close the card door before using the camera.



## Removing the SD (Secure Digital) Card/ MMC Card

To remove the SD card, turn off camera, open the SD card slot cover, gently use your finger to push the SD card inwards and then release it for the SD card to bounce out of the SD card slot as illustrated.



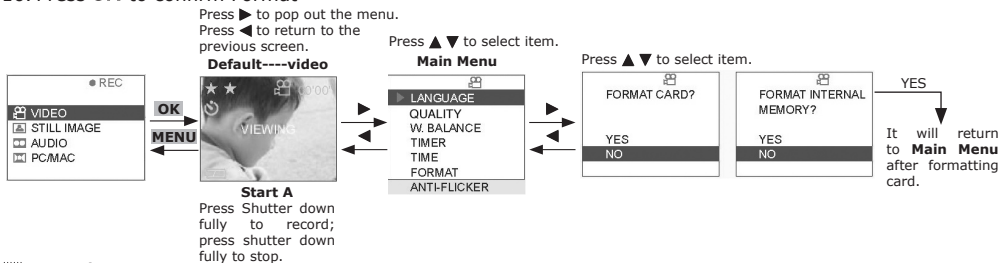
### IMPORTANT!

- Never insert any other object which is not SD Card or MMC Card into the camera's card slot. Doing so creates the risk of damage to the camera and card.
- Make sure that the terminals of the memory card is facing towards the front of the camera.
- Should water or any foreign object ever get into the card slot, immediately turn off the camera, remove the batteries or disconnect the AC adaptor, and contact your dealer or nearest service provider.
- Never remove a card from the camera while the camera is powered on. Doing so can cause the picture record operation to fail, and even damage the memory card.

## Format the SD Card/MMC Card or the Internal Memory

Formatting a memory card will delete all data already stored on it.

1. Select the Capture/playback selector to Capture Mode
2. Pull left to open the LCD panel
3. Press the Power On/Off button until the LCD on
4. Press UP and DOWN button to select "VIDEO" or "STILL IMAGE" on the LCD Display
5. Press OK Button to confirm
6. Press RIGHT button
7. Press UP and DOWN button and select "FORMAT"
8. Press RIGHT button
9. Press UP and DOWN button and select "YES" to format card(SD/MMC card) or format memory(internal)
10. Press OK to confirm Format



### Remarks:

When SD Card or MMC Card inserted, Internal Memory will be disable.

### IMPORTANT!

- You can format a memory card on the camera or on a computer. However formatting a memory card on a computer takes much longer time.
- Note that data deleted by a format operation can not be recovered. Make sure you do not need any data currently stored on a memory card before you format it.
- Formatting a memory card that contains pictures deletes all the pictures, even those that are protected.

## Memory Card Precautions

1. Use only a SD memory card or a MultiMediaCard with this camera. Proper operation is not guaranteed when any other type of card is used.
2. Electrostatic charge, electrical noise, and other phenomena can cause data to become corrupted or even lost. Always make sure that you always back up important data on other media (MO disc, computer hard disk, etc.).
3. If a memory card starts to behave abnormally, you can restore normal operation by reformatting it. However, we recommend that you always take along more than one memory card whenever using the camera far away from the home or office.
4. We recommend that you format a memory card before using it for the first time after purchasing it, or whenever the card you are using seems to be the cause of abnormal pictures. Also format a memory card if it was used in another digital camera or other device.

### 3 Playback Video/Still Image/Audio

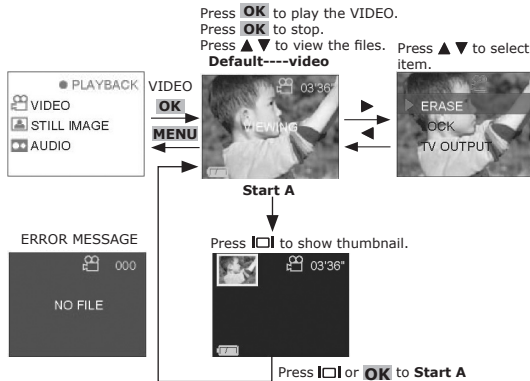
**Note:**

There is no speaker built-in. Audio file or sound of Video clip cannot be playback by the camera.

#### ● Playback Video/Still Image using the camera LCD

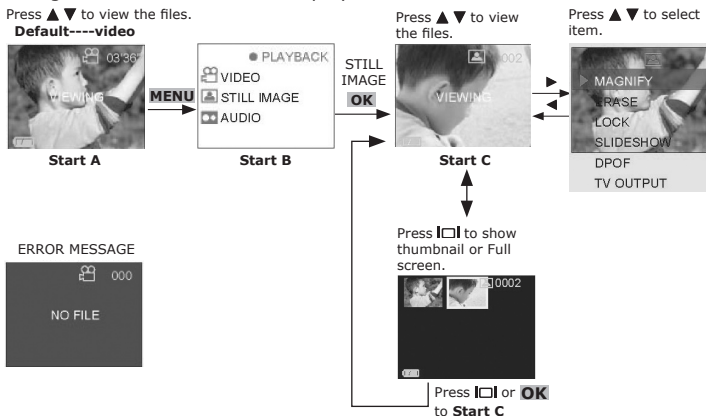
##### Playback Video on camera LCD

1. Select the Capture/playback selector to playback Mode
2. Pull left to open the LCD panel
3. Press the Power On/Off button until the LCD on
4. Press UP and DOWN button to select "VIDEO" on the LCD Display
5. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
6. Press UP and DOWN button to select files you want to playback.  
OR you can press the DISPLAY button to show Thumbnails and use the four direction button to select requested file.
7. Press **OK** Button to confirm
8. The selected Video file shown in the LCD display



##### Playback still image on camera LCD

1. Select the Capture/playback selector to playback Mode
2. Pull left to open the LCD panel
3. Press the Power On/Off button until the LCD on
4. Press UP and DOWN button to select "STILL IMAGE" on the LCD Display
5. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
6. Press UP and DOWN button to select files you want to playback.  
OR you can press the DISPLAY button to show Thumbnails and use the four direction button to select requested file.
7. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
8. The selected image file shown in the LCD display.

**Remarks:**

Since there is no built-in speaker, audio playback can only be done by TV.



## ● Playback Video/Still Image/Audio on TV

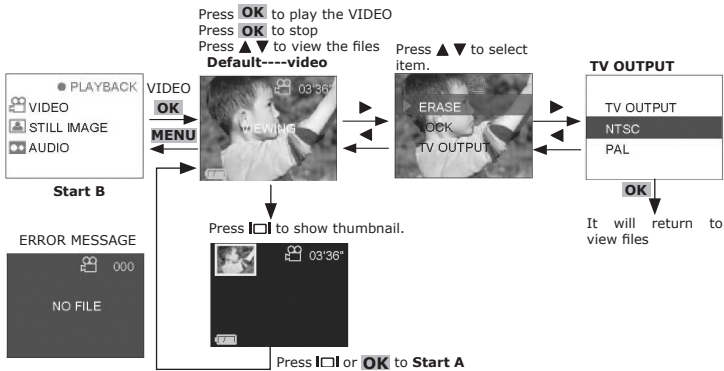
### Playback Video on TV

1. Connect the **SPYPEN AIAS/ VIVA-DVI** to the TV using the AV cable provided
2. Select the Capture/playback selector to playback Mode
3. Pull left to open the LCD panel
4. Press the Power On/Off button until the LCD on
5. Press UP and DOWN button to select "VIDEO" on the LCD Display
6. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
7. Press UP and DOWN button to select files you want to playback. OR you can press the DISPLAY button to show Thumbnails and use the four direction button to select requested file.
8. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
9. The selected Video file shown in the TV

#### Note:

If the color of the TV screen is not correct, you have to adjust the "TV output" format.

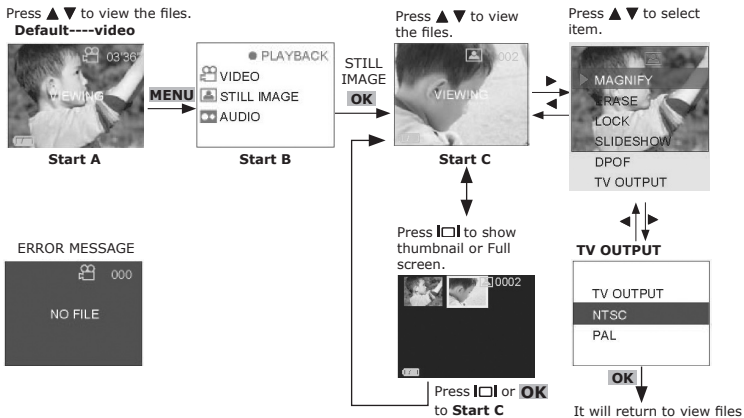
10. Press RIGHT button
11. Press UP and DOWN button to select "TV OUTPUT"
12. Press RIGHT button
13. Press UP and DOWN button to select NTSC/PAL
14. Press **OK**



### Playback Still image on TV

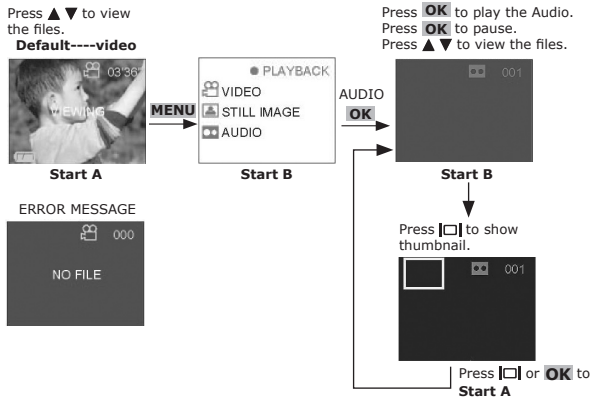

2. Select the Capture/playback selector to playback Mode
3. Pull left to open the LCD panel
4. Press the Power On/Off button until the LCD on
5. Press UP and DOWN button to select "STILL IMAGE" on the LCD Display
6. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
7. Press UP and DOWN button to select files you want to playback. OR you can press the DISPLAY button to show Thumbnails and use the four direction button to select requested file.
8. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
9. The selected Image file shown in the TV

10. Press RIGHT button
11. Press UP and DOWN button to select "TV OUTPUT"
12. Press RIGHT button

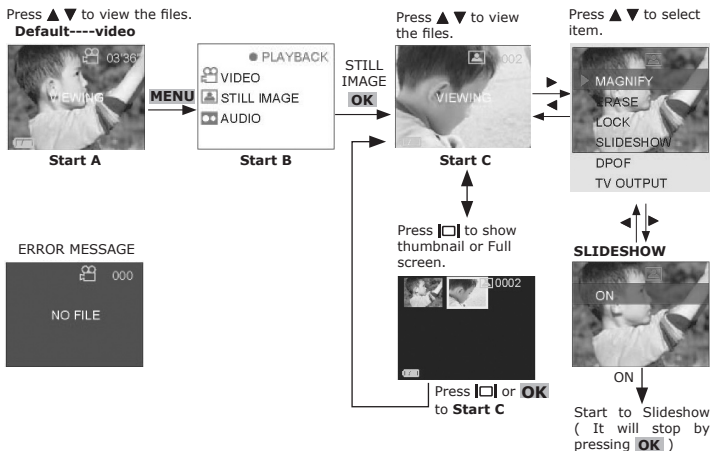
## Playback Audio files on TV

2. Select the Capture/playback selector to playback Mode

5. Press UP and DOWN button to select "AUDIO" on the LCD Display
6. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
7. Press UP and DOWN button to select files you want to playback.  
OR you can press the DISPLAY button to show Thumbnails and use the four direction button to select requested file.
8. Press OK Button **OK** to play the audio file
9. Press OK Button **OK** to stop playing the file



## ● Play Slideshow

1. Select the Capture/playback selector to playback Mode
2. Pull left to open the LCD panel
3. Press the Power On/Off button until the LCD on
4. Press UP and DOWN button to select "STILL IMAGE" on the LCD Display
5. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
6. Press UP and DOWN button to select files you want to playback.  
OR you can press the DISPLAY button to show Thumbnails and use the four direction button to select requested file.
7. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
8. The selected image file shown in the LCD display
9. Press RIGHT button
10. Press UP and DOWN button to select "SLIDESHOW"
11. Press RIGHT button
12. Press UP and DOWN button to select ON
13. Press **OK**
14. The camera will Start to slideshow. It will stop by pressing **OK**.

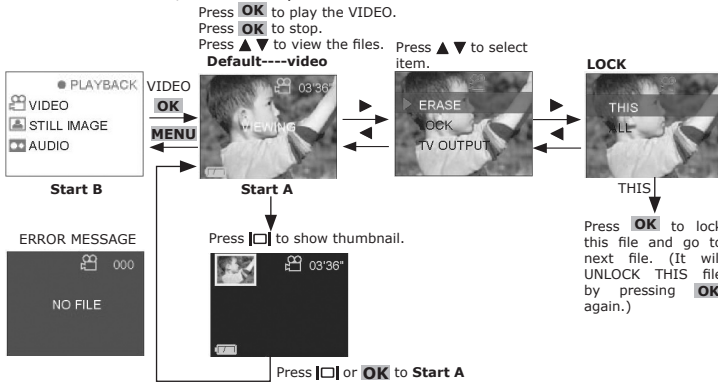


## ● Protect the files

**Remarks:**  
Lock function can only protect file from erasing. It can not protect the file if we format the memory card or the internal memory.

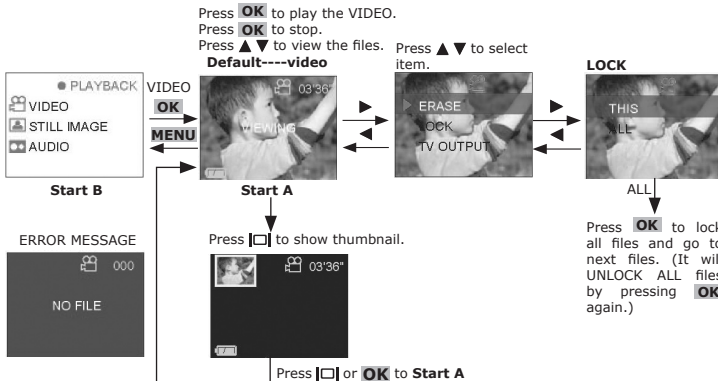
### Lock one file

1. Select the Capture/playback selector to playback Mode
2. Pull left to open the LCD panel
3. Press the Power On/Off button until the LCD on
4. Press UP and DOWN button to select "VIDEO/STILL IMAGE/AUDIO" on the LCD Display, depend on what kind of files you want to protect
5. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
6. Press UP and DOWN button to select files you want to protect
7. Press RIGHT button
8. Press UP and DOWN button to select "LOCK"
9. Press RIGHT button
10. Press UP and DOWN button to select "THIS" to protect the selected file
11. Press OK button **OK** to confirm protect selected file and return to previous screen. (It will UNLOCK THIS file by pressing the OK button **OK** again.)
12. A lock icon will so on the LCD, left of the picture no.



### Lock ALL files

1. Select the Capture/playback selector to playback Mode
2. Pull left to open the LCD panel
3. Press the Power On/Off button until the LCD on
4. Press UP and DOWN button to select "VIDEO/STILL IMAGE/AUDIO" on the LCD Display, depend on what kind of files you want to protect
5. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
6. Press UP and DOWN button to select files you want to protect
7. Press RIGHT button
8. Press UP and DOWN button to select "LOCK"
9. Press RIGHT button
10. Press UP and DOWN button to select "ALL" to protect all files
11. Press OK button **OK** to confirm protect all files and return to previous screen. (It will UNLOCK ALL files by pressing the OK button **OK** again.)
12. A lock icon will so on the LCD, left of the picture no.

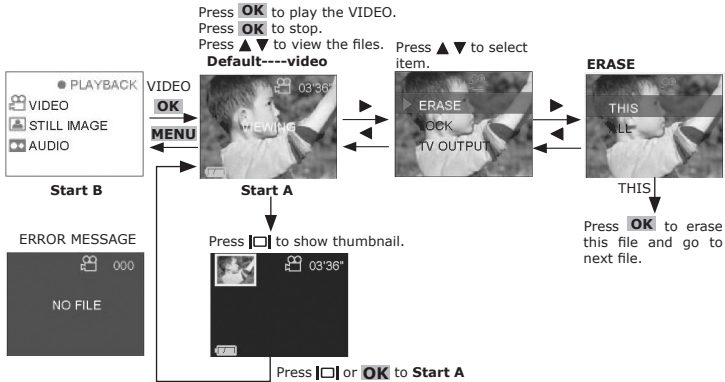


## • Delete files

To delete file inside the memory card or internal memory of **SPYPEN AIAS/VIVA-DVI**.

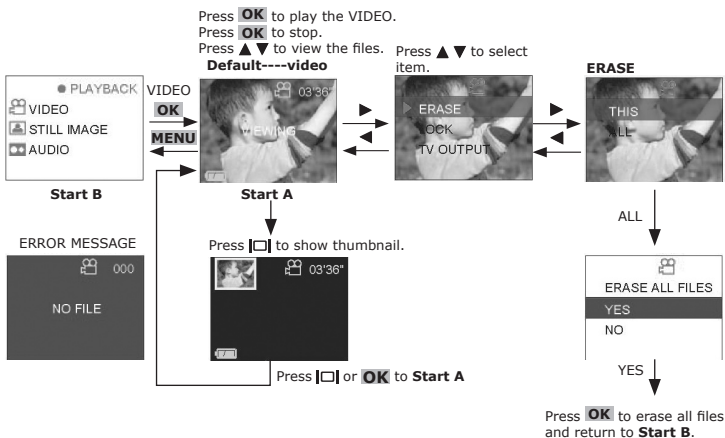
### Delete One file

1. Select the Capture/playback selector to playback Mode
2. Pull left to open the LCD panel
3. Press the Power On/Off button until the LCD on
4. Press UP and DOWN button to select "VIDEO/STILL IMAGE/AUDIO" on the LCD Display, depend on what kind of files you want to delete
5. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
6. Press UP and DOWN button to select files you want to delete
7. Press RIGHT button
8. Press UP and DOWN button to select "ERASE"
9. Press RIGHT button
10. Press UP and DOWN button to select "THIS" to delete the selected file
11. Press OK button **OK** to confirm delete selected file and return to next file



### Delete ALL file

1. Select the Capture/playback selector to playback Mode
2. Pull left to open the LCD panel
3. Press the Power On/Off button until the LCD on
4. Press UP and DOWN button to select "VIDEO/STILL IMAGE/AUDIO" on the LCD Display, depend on what kind of files you want to delete
5. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
6. Press UP and DOWN button to select files you want to delete
7. Press RIGHT button
8. Press UP and DOWN button to select "ERASE"
9. Press RIGHT button
10. Press UP and DOWN button to select "ALL"
11. Press OK button **OK** and then select YES for double confirm
12. Press **OK** to process delete all files

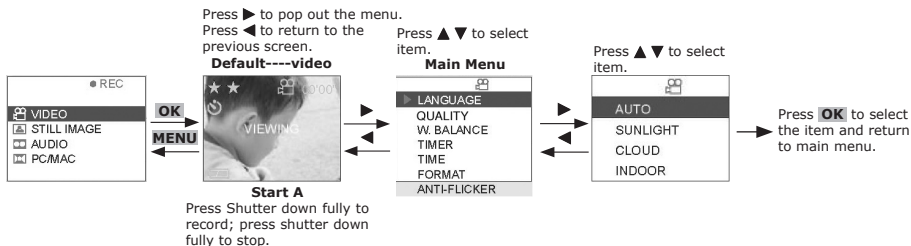
## ● Turn the icon off and turn the LCD off

To turn the icon off, just simply press the DISPLAY button **⏏** once, press it again will turn off the LCD. To turn on the display again, press DISPLAY button **⏏** one more time.

i.e. Press Display button **⏏** (Turn off ICON). Press Display button **⏏** (Turn off LCD display). Press Display button **⏏** (Turn on ICON and LCD display)

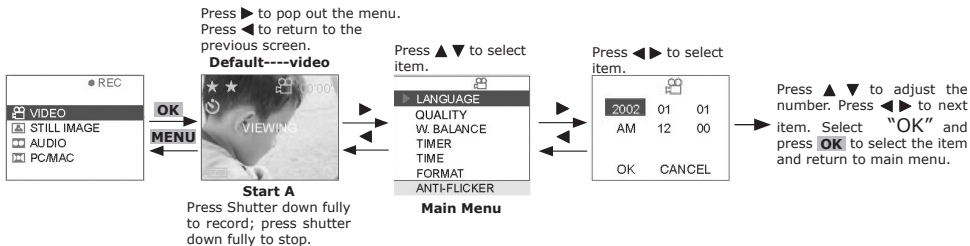
## ● Setting White Balance

1. Select the Capture/playback selector to Capture Mode **📷**
2. Pull left to open the LCD panel **📷**
3. Press the Power On/Off button **⏏** until the LCD on
4. Press UP **▲** and DOWN **▼** button to select "VIDEO" or "STILL IMAGE" on the LCD Display
5. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
6. Press RIGHT button **▶**
7. Press UP **▲** and DOWN **▼** button and select "W.balance"
8. Press RIGHT button **▶**
9. Press UP **▲** and DOWN **▼** button to select the white balance setting you prefers
10. Press OK button **OK** to confirm White Balance Setting selected and return to Main Menu
11. Press LEFT button **◀** to resume Capture Mode



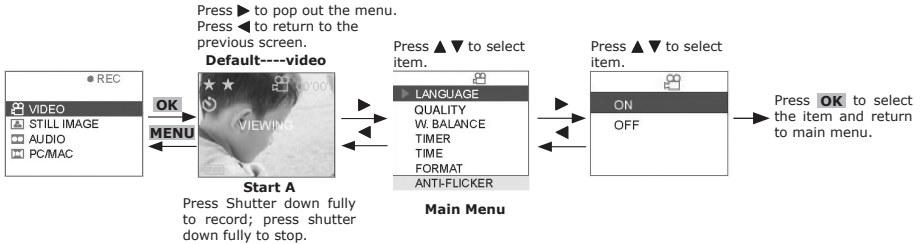
## ● Setting Time

1. Select the Capture/playback selector to Capture Mode **📷**
2. Pull left to open the LCD panel **📷**
3. Press the Power On/Off button **⏏** until the LCD on

6. Press RIGHT button **▶**

12. Press LEFT button **◀** to resume Capture Mode



## ● Set Time Stamp (Still Image only)

1. Select the Capture/playback selector to Capture Mode
2. Pull left to open the LCD panel
3. Press the Power On/Off button until the LCD on
4. Press UP and DOWN button to select "STILL IMAGE" on the LCD Display
5. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
6. Press RIGHT button
7. Press UP and DOWN button and select "TIME STAMP"
8. Press RIGHT button
9. Press UP and DOWN button and select "ON" to activate Time Stamp
10. Press OK button **OK** to confirm time stamp activated and return to main menu
11. Press LEFT button to resume Capture Mode

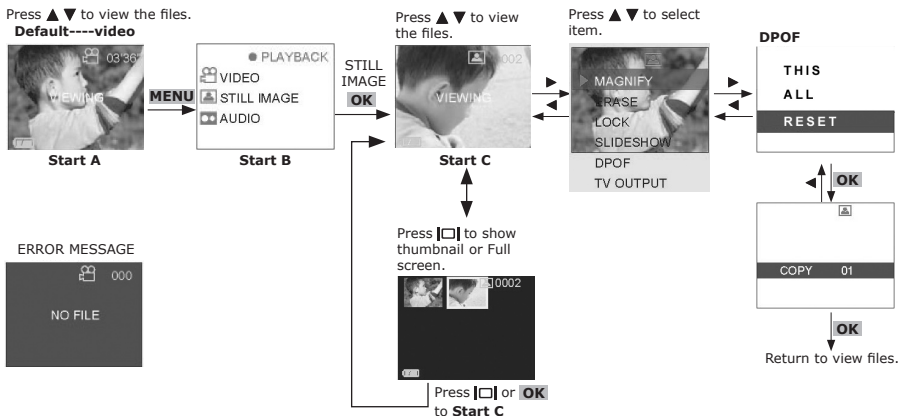


## ● Set DPOF
















### NOTE:

- DPOF only available when SD Card or MMC Card is inserted.
- All DPOF files are protected. Users cannot delete them using the erase function.













1. Select the Capture/playback selector to playback Mode
2. Pull left to open the LCD panel
3. Press the Power On/Off button until the LCD on
4. Press UP and DOWN button to select "STILL IMAGE" on the LCD Display
5. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
6. Press UP and DOWN button to select files you want to set DPOF.  
OR you can press the DISPLAY button to show Thumbnails and use the four direction to select requested file.
7. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
8. Press RIGHT button
9. Press UP and DOWN button to select "DPOF"
10. Press RIGHT button
11. Press UP and DOWN button to select "THIS" or "ALL"
12. Press **OK**
13. Press UP and DOWN button to select the number of copy you want
14. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm DPOF format and return to main menu

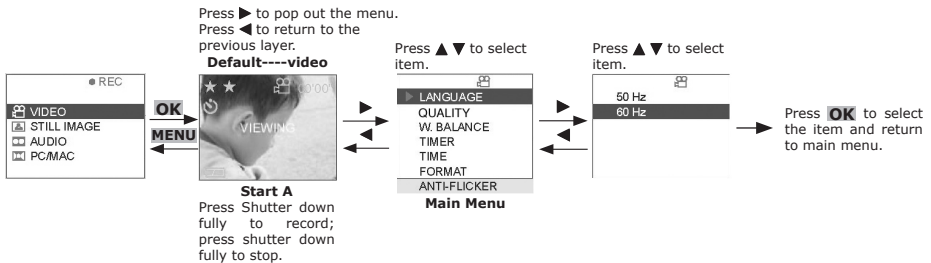

6. Press UP  and DOWN  button to select files you want to cancel DPOF.  
OR you can press the DISPLAY button  to show Thumbnails and use the four direction button to select requested file.
7. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm
8. Press RIGHT button 
9. Press UP  and DOWN  button to select "DPOF"
10. Press RIGHT button 
11. Press UP  and DOWN  button to select "THIS" (If you want to cancel DPOF for all files, please select "RESET" and then go to step 14.)
12. Press **OK**
13. Press UP  and DOWN  button to select the number of copy to "00"
14. Press OK Button **OK** to confirm and return to main menu

## ● Set anti-Flicker

1. Select the Capture/playback selector to Capture Mode 
2. Pull left to open the LCD panel 
3. Press the Power On/Off button  until the LCD on
4. Press UP  and DOWN  button to select "VIDEO" or "STILL IMAGE" on the LCD Display

6. Press RIGHT button
